FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hello Everyone,

Open Forum Information:

PIERS: Divers from the engineering firm that is making plans and applying for permits to repair the piers, have completed their inspection to confirm what work is required. Now it will be 6 to 8 weeks to prepare plans for permits to repair or replace the piers. Permit applications to several government agencies will take the most time, maybe 6 months. If Sun repairs them, work will take 4 to 6 weeks, replacing them will require 8 to 12 weeks. All this means about a year to complete the work. The floating dock will be done after all repairs are made to avoid permitting problems and delays.

PONDS: The lack of rain has lowered the pond levels severely. Results are algae in the north pond since all water flows from south to north. Treatment of the pond is limited to avoid increased algae growth and staying within environmental guidelines. A healthy discussion ended with Tiffany's full explanation of how the problem must be attacked and to avoid stimulation of further algae growth. The north pond is getting sediment from the other ponds. Dredging is limited to avoid more algae/weeds, and Hydrilla in the pond from multiplying. All ponds are much better than a couple years ago after cautious and diligent treatment.

GATE ENTRY: There is no plan to eliminate manning the north gate. The new entry system is working properly to maximize our privacy. Visitors will use the kiosk to find your name, call the number, then you enter 9 to open the gate. Or you provide your security code, not recommended, to allow a visitor to enter. If you are driving a loaner car or riding with a non-resident, you must use your 5 digit code to open the gate. The attendants are there to allow Fedex, etc to enter.

There **will not** be a HOA meeting in July or August. There **will** be HOA Board meetings. Enjoy your summer and be safe travelling.

HOME MAINTENANCE AND SAFETY TIPS NEW HVAC SYSTEMS

As some of you have discovered, most new air conditioning systems are much larger than the older ones. Besides sometimes having a bigger foot print, most are much taller. Add a concrete hurricane rated base, that was not present before, and now your system may be sitting 12 or more inches taller than before. So now the cover that worked fine with your old system is not going to work. There are basically three options to fix this dilemma. You can build the walls around your system taller, you can build a new cover, or modify the existing cover, or switch to closing off the access to the space under your house at the sides of the unit.

Building the walls taller is probably the least common for several reasons. If you add additional bricks, you are likely hiring a masonry person and spending more money than you want. Another reason to not use this method, is the restriction of air flow it may cause, and your system needs good air flow to function properly.

Rebuilding the existing cover is the most common solution. Rebuilding the sides higher, or adding sides with a screen will allow air flow is also the most straight forward method.

Adding/installing panels on each side of the air conditioning unit to close off the access space to get under your house can sometimes be a good option. However, sometimes it gets complicated. Filling the gap while still allowing the electrical wiring and possibly other utilities to pass through the openings makes this option difficult.

The reason for having a cover or panels is to prevent rodents from easily gaining access to the space under your house. These rodents can cause damage to HVAC ducts, electrical wiring, and plumbing water lines. It is very difficult to prevent small animals such as lizards, toads, or other small animals from getting under the house, however they rarely cause damage. Concentrate on preventing larger animals, mostly rodents from getting under the house. The company that installs your new system is not likely going to be able to help with this issue, but a good handyman should be able to handle the job.
